John Harris, no longer skating for SIMS, is now wearing the Northern Calif. colors of Santa Cruz/NHS/ INDY. The folks up North are putting a massive effort in support of Pros and Amateurs in ASPO and GOLD CUP competitions. Some of the top amateurs in ASPO were representing the No. Cal. group.

Details are still sketchy about the August 30, "downhill" and "slalom" competion to be held in Northern California. The SANTA CRUZ/ NHS/INDY sponsored event will be the biggest of the summer up there. We're expecting more details in the next issue.

Also on tap for AUGUST 30, is the VANS/GES Freestule event to be held at the OASIS skatepark. Additional sponsorship is now being sought, but according to Steve Cathey, from G & S, it looks like it will "go" and hopefully will have the same energies of the Oceanside events of years past. High costs to put on the Ocenaside were the main reason why this year it will not be held there. It seems that the city wants a big cut. Still, freestyle interest is once again gaining.

We hear the same song from other parts of the country. They still want Freestyle competitions. It seems more in line because they can be held almost anywhere, parking lots, shopping malls and auditoriums.

The AUGUST 2, ASPO # 2, will have a tight slalom event, in addition to the pool event. So get out your thin gyrating stick and start practicing. If you don't have one, maybe get together with someone who has one and share it for the event. You want to be a top ASPO skater, you've got to skate everything man!

Stacy Peralta reports on his recent trip to the Scandinavian countries in this issue. His report is enthusiastic. Check it out.

The COLTON pool is now completed and skateable. First hand reports are that it came out great and that with the exception of the coping being a bit out too far, a situation which is being corrected this week, it will be one of the best pools around.

In previous issues we have printed AUGUST 30-31 as the Gold Cup date at COLTON. This is wrong! The date is AUGUST 23-24, one week before, so mark this on your calendar.

Geoff Phillips is no longer with GULL WING. Owner Walt Tiedge will resume all responsibilities for the company.

Yes Virginia, Pomona Pipe and Pool, formerly New Wave, formerly Pomona Pipe and Pool skatepark, is once again in operation and doing just fine. They want everyone to know that all pools are open and ready for heavy sessioning.

F.A.S.T. (the Florida Amateur Skateboard Tournaments) Circuit has cancelled the last three events of the season. Reason: "apathy" Skaters and promoters alike didn't show alot of interest in participating and or promoting the circuit. The July 12 event at Rainbow wave in Tampa was cancelled at the last minute. Kit Traverso, operator of the facility said that he would continue to let skaters skate, but that he was not interested in holding any more competitions, this as reparted by Richard Blalock, director of FAST.

Many people have called ASPO to find out how they can draw such great interest in competitions. The answer is promotion of the sport, incentives for the skaters to compete on a regular basis (ASPO points, Gold Cards, Trophies, etc.) and the entire cooperation of all Park Owners involved. Without it, it's back to the same old song.

One phase of skateboarding thet seems to have improved the most is deck manufacturing. The first series of changes happend from 1974 to 1978. This era saw the improvement in deck construction. The next changes developed in 1978 and continue to this day. This series of improvements includes board shapes. Here are a few examples:


1) STINGERS (ex: Caster/ Inouye); By placing a relief in the side of the deck, the contour shape to the tail can be altered. This provides for a fuller nose for less foot sliding, while not losing any power, or control at the kick tail. This also reduces the weight of the deck.

2) WINGERS (ex: Sims/Andrecht); Basically the same as the stinger, but the relief cut is placed

THE BIG O SKATEPARK WAS THE SITE FOR THE SECOND IN THE SERIES OF FIVE PRO EVENTS SCHEDULED FOR THIS YEAR AS PART OF the GOLD CUP Series.

This becomes repetitious, but once again we've got to say that every event brings out more surprises and more excellent skating. And this was the best to date.

The winner?

Well, he started by qualifying second on Saturday. But then, it seemed that on Sunday, he was having trouble putting it all together.

He got into the quarter finals by placing 7th in the 10-skater "cut".

The next "cut" would be for the top five skaters.

Once again, he had to runoff with two other skaters to make the final. Only two of the three would remain. Then on the "Final", his first run(of three) was a total disaster, scoring him one of his lowest points, a 74.66.

The next two runs, would have to be near perfection if he were to figure in the top spot.

Well, it appears that DUANE PETERS(NHS/INDY/SANTA CRUZ) is at home in moments like these.

The harder the pressure, the better he performs.

If he were in a SWAT Team, he'd be the first storming through the door.

His second run earned him a 92.33 and the third, (the best for the last) earned him a 92.66, high score for the meet.

The 185 combined points made Duane \$700. richer and 100 Gold Cup points toward the overall championship.

In second, with 184.33, only 2/3 a point less from first, was once again Eldie Elg-

Eddie now holds the overall lead in the Gold Cup with two seconds, with a total of 190 points.

In third place, with an outstanding performance, in only his second pro eventwas Steve Caballero.

Eric Grisham placed fourth and Ray Rodrigues made up the top five in the Finals.

SATURDAY QUALIFYERS:

A total entry of 25 Pros and 35 Amateurs made the program.

Pros had to qualify by making their "compulsory" run and their "freestyle" run in the pool.

While the Capsule pool may have posted some problems in trying to make all the compulsory tricks, those that took time out to practice the mandatory tricks breezed through them, while others had great difficulty.


This caused skaters such as Allen Losi, Doug Saladino, Chris Strople, Steve Olson, to lose too many points in the compulsory, to qualify for Sunday's events.

ASPO#1 - 12 hours of unreal AMATEUR COMPETITION

UNBELIEVABLE, AMAZING, I DID NOT EXPECT THIS, THIS IS A FANTASTIC TURN OUT... THESE WERE SOME OF THE COMMENTS THAT WERE HEARD THIS PAST WEEK END AT THE FIRST ASPO AT DEL MAR.

JULY 12,1980

OF THE 182 ENTRIES AND MAYBE 100 OR SO SPECTATORS, THAT WERE ON HAND THIS WEEKEND TO TAKE PART OF THE ASPO OPENER, not one complaint was lodged in the way the contest was organized or run.

Before-hand, preparation was made by Wayne Searle and his staff at DEL MAR, to run a smooth contest.

The amazing part and the credit that should be given to the Del Mar staff and the ASPO staff, is that as of Friday, the day before the event, estimates of entries were around the 100 mark.

That they were able to process 182 entries and about 120 new ASPO memberships and still start on schedule, at 11am. is short of a miracle.

If there's a negative to this affair, it is that you just can't run through 182 competitors taking 2 runs in 2 events in any less time than the 12 hours that it took to complete this contest.

ASPO officials are now contemplating the idea of a two day affair.

In other words, if the entries continue at this rate, it may be necessary to run a two-day ASPO, Saturday and Sunday, to lessen the waiting period between runs.

It is a problem that all ASPO people are happy to face. Heretofore, the "big problem" was how to get kids to participate.

"Now that we seem to be getting the entries, we

look to a two-day affair and splitting up classes so that no one group has too long of a wait", announced Lou Peralta.

Other ideas, such as, running four separate events instead of two, and splitting skaters among all four, may be a way to cut down the length of each event.

The next ASPO at SKATERCROSS should give a better indication as to future events.

HEATS:

There's no longer a 10 and Under class, they have all been combined under the 12 and Under category. This did not seem to bother the skaters, especially Doug Cobalis. He picked up where he left off last season with a double win in the Park Team class, for his home park, The Colton Ranch.

Doug was followed by Chris Black(OASIS) in second in the pool event and Jeff Heath(LAKEWOOD) in the Slalom event.

No question that he is the skater to beat this season.

The Park Team 13-14 Pool event belonged to Dave Eckles(DEL MAR). He showed that knowing your own pool helps. He performed all his tricks with great control and style, using the entire wide radius of the pool.

GOLD CUP

The compulsory routine makes up 25% of the skater's overall qualifying score, which makes it hard for a skater who does not do well in this phase to make up that many points in the freestyle part of it.

What's the solution for this disparity?

Work on your compulsory tricks because they count.

Saturday's qualifier was led by Powell/Peralta skater Steve Caballero, who finished with 116.66 points.

In second was Duane Peters, (SANTA CRUZ/NHS/INDY) with 113.66, followed in third by Eric Grisham(VARIFLEX) with 112.66.

Rounding out the top five was another POWELL/PERALTA skater, Mike McGill and in fifth, Mickey Alba, (G & S/INDY) winner of the OASIS Gold Cup.

Bert LaMar(SIMS), Steve Alba (NHS/INDY), Ray Rodriguez (POWELL/PERALTA), Fred DeSoto(VARIFLEX), Eddie Elguera (VARIFLEX), Steve Hirsch (VARIFLEX), Dave Andrecht (SIMS), Mike Smith(DOG TOWN) Brad Bowman(SIMS) and Mike Folmer(SIMS) made up the top fifteen qualifying spots.

In the AMATEUR division, it was POWELL/PERALTA skater David "Z", leading the way, ahead of Lance Mountain; newly acquired VARIFLEX skater, then Jim Gray (G&S), Eddie Meek(NHS) and Bob Serafin(SANTA CRUZ/INDY), who made up the top five.

Qualifying for Sunday's finals were, Jamie Godfrey, Bill Ruff, Christian Hosoi, Tim Cunningham, Scott Foss, Mike Hirsch, John Gibson, John Ernst, Neil Blender, and in the last qualifying spot was Roland Cobalis.

SUNDAY AMATEUR SEMI!

At 3pm in the afternoon, three heats of five amateur skaters were run, each having two runs. The best of the two would count. The five best scores would go right to the FINAL.

Tied for first, were Bob Serafin(NHS/INDY) and Lance Mountain(VARIFLEX) with same scores; 88.66.

There was no need of a runoff, as this was not for the "cut" spot.

In third was POWELL's David "Z", tied will G&S' Billy Ruff. The last transfer to the final was given to Mike Hirsch(VARIFLEX).

Notably different in this event, was the fact that all serious practice by skaters was done in the early part of the day.

Once the program began, all skaters would get one 15sec run to warm up.

So right after the SEMI, the top five were named and the Amateur Final was started.

AMATEUR FINALS:

As in all Gold Cup Finals, skaters get three runs, instead of two. The two best runs are combined and the highest total wins.

Lance Mountain(VARIFLEX) put on an excellent first and third run to earn him 176.66 points and first place, just a fraction of a point ahead of Bob Serafin(NHS/INDY) who took second with a score of 176.


Both skaters put on a great aerial display and, although at times their runs seemed a bit sketchy, they scored high enough to lead the way.


In third was Mike Hirsch, fourth Bill Ruff and fifth David "Z": tesd not sit a zew

SUNDAY PRO QUARTER FINALS:

First heat saw Mike Folmer, Steve Hirsch, Freddy DeSoto Mickey Alba and Eric Grisham all go against each other.

Topping that field was Eric Grisham who scored a 90.66 on his first run. The biggest point getting trick in his routine is his "varial channel jump" which he has down to perfection. It's an unreal maneuver.

In the second heat, there was a tie for best score between Dave Andrecht and Bert LaMar, both SIMS teammates.

Dave's huge backside airs earned him 89.66 on his second run and Bert scored the same on his first run.

Dave's the guy that goes for the "big" trick which, at times, will earn him big points, but will also lose points if he doesn't make it.

Bert had a clean first run with channel airs and hand plants that were near perfection.

In the Third Heat, there were three big scores.

Tieing with 91.00 were Steve Caballero and Eddie Elguera.

Steve had huge front-side and backside channel airs and a front-side hand plant, while Eddie pulled off a new trick; a "channel air to a foot-plant". You've got to see it to believe it.

Out of these three heats, the next cut to 10 was made. This made up the Semi event. There was a tie for tenth place and a final transfer spot to the Semi, between
Brad Bowman(SIMS) and Steve
Alba(NHS/INDY)

A run-off was necessary to break the tie and Brad emerged the victor.

PRO SEMI:

The First Heat was made up of skaters: Brad Bowman, Steve Hirsch, Bert LaMar, Ray Rodriguez and Eddie Elguera.

When you get to this point in the competition, you don't do anything different than what got you there, except you try to do it better.

Surprisingly, Ray Rodriguez was one of the top points skaters in this heat, as he performed his routines to the max. Excellent aerials, channels, hand plants, rollout tail stalls made up his routine, to earn him a 90.66 and tie him with Eddie Elguera.

Both skaters used their 2nd run to get them into the final.

Andrecht, Eric Grisham and Steve Caballero go for it.

Topping that field was Steve Caballero, with front-side ollie channel airs, varial-hand plants, miller flips. His efforts scored the highest scores of both heats with a high of 92.00.

There was a three way tie with 90.00 each, between Mickey Alba, Eric Grisham and Duane Peters.

Caballero, Rodriguez and Elguera had qualified for the top three spots in the final, now there were only two more spots to fill, with three skaters to fill them.

A run-off was necessary and eliminated from the finals was Mickey Alba, who fell a couple of times to Eric's one fall and Duane's clean run.

PRO FINAL:

The stage was set. As we stated before, each skater would get three runs. The best two runs out of the three would make up the overall score.

Duane Peters made his first run, which was his poorest for the entire event. He earned 74.66 after several falls.

Then it was Eric Grisham. He had his "varial channel air" wired but the rest of his routine seemed a bit subdued. He made all his tricks clean, but certainly lacking maximum effort. He earned an 89.66 for his first run.


Eddie Elguera scored the highest of all first runs with a 92.00 by performing his routines as he had done in the spots before.

Ray Rodriguez also had a clean run but the extensions were not there.

Finally, Steve Caballero's first run was great with an outrageous hand plant, that kept him close to Elguera. Steve's score was a 91.00

On the skater's second run, Duane Peters served notice that anyone wishing to collect first place money had to get past him.

With his back against the wall, after a poor first

run, he had to make the next two runs count.

The "master of disaster" was on the proverbial cliff.

Every time he hit a wall, it looked like he would bail into a nasty fall.

His tail slides to the channel hip were outrageous, indy airs were two feet past coping and every trick was on the edge.

His score proved that this is what the judges were looking for as he scored a 92.33.

Under pressure, Eric Grisham came back for the second time with the same routine, but now pulling all stops. Extending every trick to earn top points. His score was a 91.66

Answering the calls was Eddie Elguera. He too made all his tricks, but you could feel that they were all pushed to the max. He got a 92.33, tieing with Duane.

Ray Rodriguez bettered his first run, but not eanough to really put him in contention. He had an 89.33

Steve Caballero looked like he made an identical second run to his first, yet he received a lower score of 90.33. Now, the final third run had to be made.

While Duane had scored and excellent second run, he was still trailing by quite a bit because of his dismal first run. So, this had to be the one.

If he scored anything less than 90 points, he would not make the top three.

Well, the SANTA CRUZ/INDY skater saved the best for last.

He's got to be the best improvisational skater. He doesn't let you know what he's going to do next. Maybe he himself doesn't know. So when you watch him, the anticipation as to what's to come next is what makes his runs unique. The crowd sensed this.

What they got was Duane, pulling all the stops edging out for 45 sec. and, in the process earning the highest points of the meet for his third run; a 92.66.

The total combined points for his second and third run gave Duane 185 points total and first place, edging Eddie Elguera, with 184.33 by a fraction of a point.

Cabaliero got third with 183, fourth went to Grisham with 181 and in fifth place was Rodriguez with 179.

During the awards all top ten skaters were called up to receive their share of the purse and to be interviewed by D.David Morin for the television cameras.

Although these guys are fantastic skaters, they leave a little to be desired in public speaking.

Perhaps, team managers should spend some time with their skaters, coaching them in the fine art of articulating in front of a crowd.

If the sport is ever to grow, this is a must, which at times will be as important as the skating itself.

Don Hoffman and the BIG O still put on a great show for a great crowd.









ASPO#1 DEL MAR

Second in the pool was Richard Armijo, (Skate City) who lost by one point. In third was a new face to ASPO, Bobby DeCasas, skating for the BIG O team.

In the SLALOM, Bill Wahl, also a new comer to ASPO made his presence known to all by capturing first place for the Lakewood team, just one-tenth of a second ahead of Pipeline skater, Eddie Bettencourt. Bobby De Casas placed third.

The 15-17 Park pool event was won by local skater Todd Joseph(DEL MAR). In second, it was Brian Henson, who once again may be the skater to be beaten in this class. Brian rides for the Big O.

Todd also took the Slalom event, edging out by one-tenth of a second, Pipeline skater, Tim Galvan.

The Open Pool event belonged to another Del Mar local, Owen Nieder. He managed to score one more point than second place winner Jim Coane(SKATERCROSS). While Owen showed excellent form in his pool, the man to watch in this class will be Jim Coane, as he is a consistant high finisher in any pool he skates.

The Slalom event was won by Andre Watts (MARINA). Andre has to be considered one of the best in Banked Slalom. He picked up where he left

off last season, taking the slalom event. In second it was Todd Smoke(BIG 0) and once again Jim Coane(SKATER-CROSS).

1-A UNSPONSORED

Having combined all 10 & Under skaters from last season into the 12 & Under division for this year, did not present a major problem.

There were fears that these young kids would not have a chance with the older ones.

Tim Phillips, did not seem to have any problems disposing of the older skaters. He took first place in the Pool event.

Tim is now going to change to the 2A division and try

3-A SEMI PRO


These guys were the Sponsored skaters of last season.

They are the best amateurs and for the most part, they're all sponsored skateers, although you need not be sponsored to skate this class.


You just have to be good and want to be noticed.





SKATE in SHAPE

BY JOHN WYGAND

John Wygand is a student at the University of Florida, majoring in Recreation, and currently serving his internship at Sensation Basin Park.

SKATEBOARDERS, LIKE ANY OTHER ATHLETES, WILL BE ABLE TO SKATE BETTER AND LONGER AND have more fun if they are stronger, looser and in good shape.

Lifting weights is an excellent way to increase overall strength and muscle tone.

However, the primary concern of skateboarders should be to increase flexibility and cardiovascular endurance.

You will find that your tricks will come alot easier and the probability of injuries will lessen if you are stretched out and really loose when you skate.

Let's face it, your body gets into some radical positions when you skate, most of which you aren't used to. For a skateboarder to start trying to shred a pool without having first warmed up and stretched out is like starting a brand new car for the first time and reving the engine as high as it can go...the car has a good chance of blowing up.

It is also important to be

in shape when you skate, especially during the dead heat of summer. After all, the longer you can skate without getting tired, the more fun you'll have.

The heat makes your body work that much harder, so it is a good idea to be "ready" for your summer sessions.

It isn't safe to skate in the intense heat when you're not in shape.

Running, swimming and basketball are probably the best. ways to increase your endurance and to sweat out the previous nights party.

Try to exercise in the cool of the evening and push yourself a little.

You will find that when everyone else at your favorite skate spot is wimping out, you'll still be going on.

Here's an outline of a warm up program used by the Sensation Basin Skate Club. You can substitute exercises and vary them to suit yourself:

Jumping jacks
Hurdler's stretch(ea.leg)
Groin Stretch
Trunk Twist & Arm Swing
High leg kick
Ankle twist
Push-ups(arm's wide)
Run(start with a mile)

Skate tough.






