They are very much open and ready to do all kinds of business. We were misinformed by several sources and when we called several times to verify, we weren't able to reach anyone at the park. Boy, when you make a mistake, you hear from everybody. We've must have received about 50 calls from skaters and parents.

FLASH! Gordon & Smith, tells us that they've got a bunch of new "stuff' coming out soon but they will not tell until you see it in their ad in the next few issues. What could it be? It's RUFF? to guess, huh!

Even though the COLTON ASPO had less entries than the previous ASPO at Skate City, (COLTON had 173!), we saw many new faces joining the circuit at this late stage of the game. Which means that even though some of these skaters may not have a chance to wind up in the top spots of each class or division, they still want to join in the fun and perhaps start getting ready for next year.

The ASPO's bring together so many great skaters, that just to make one and watch others do their thing, will help you learn a carload of new tricks. And that's where it's at.

"THRASHER" is the name of the new magazine or tabloid that will be published in Northern California and it's due to be out by December 1. It promises to fill the gap between skateboarder and skater, like a Rolling Stone type of magazine/ paper.

Pacific Style's Dave MacIntire, formerly with G & S, says that their new trucks will be out sometime in February 1981. Mold and castings are being done in Germany, we undertand, and should be coming into the States soon.

The "back to school lull" inherent to this time of the year

seems to be over, as reported by some manufacturers and some parks. Business is still slow but on the rebound. It could be that everyone is waiting for the Holidays to get closer to go out and go crazy and buy all the latest goodies.

Our Editor has promised for sure that next issue will have a complete list of all sponsored skaters. This has been in the works for a long time, but it now appears that it is inevitable. If you haven't been contacted and you have some skaters in your team, be sure to call us and fill us in on your sam. This list will include all types of skaters and where ever they're located.

SIMS is really putting forth an effort to pick up amateur skaters for next season's ASPO and any other amateur competition. They will be holding an "expression session", possibly in December sometime to see as many skaters as possible. Tom Sims is really going to go all out to field the best amateur team, he says.

Sensation Basin, in Gainsville, Florida is getting ready for their Third Annual Pepsi Team Challenge. The event is to take place over a two day period, starting on November 28 and winding

Ever since the GLSA and FAST series back east concluded, we haven't heard much from you guys out there. I know it's cold and maybe you're getting some snow, but hey, don't tell me you've stopped skating? We understand, much to our regret that FAST(Florida Amateur Skateboard Tournamets) is no longer active. It's a shame because there's alot of hot skaters back there that need the show case of competition to do their stuff. There are several parks that are still interested in putting together a circuit or becoming part of one. Rumor has it that maybe a couple of parks from Florida and Alabama may be part of a new circuit that may be part of the ASPO National Program. This program will involve those parks plus some of the parks in the East Coast and the Great Lakes parks so that they are all operating under one set of rules and guidelines and under one National points system. cause they were at least assured of two runs.

It's still not decided if this same format will be used at the next ASPO at Pipeline, but it certainly solved the problems and complaints of being "snaked" out of their practice runs.

The contest did last a bit longer due to the practice sessions between classes and a faulty scoreboard, but still the competition ended by 8:30 pm.

The "overall" Park Team competition grew tighter between current leader SKATERCROSS and second place, BIG O team.

BIG O moved from third to second and now it is only 65 points behind SKATERCROSS.

COLTON finds itself now in third and PIPELINE dropped from the number two spot to fourth.

Still, the first four teams are only separated by 115 points.

This means that if any team skater misses but one of the remaining six events, the standings could change considerably.

Also worth noting is the fact that both PIPELINE and BIG O have yet to host their ASPO event. This should help them in the standings.

Today at COLTON, the overall team was the BIG O team, who just beat out the home park by 3 points!

BIG O scored a total of 720 points to COLTON's 717.

In third it was the team from the LAKEWOOD Skatepark, followed in fourth by SKATERCROSS.

ASPO #6 -COLTON.

NOW THAT MANY OF THE EASTERN PARKS HAVE CLOSED DOWN FOR THE WINTER AND COMPETITIONS ARE NOT SCHEDULED UNTIL SPRING, IT'S COMFORTING TO NOTE THAT THE ACTION IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA IS STILL HOT AND HEAVY AND ASPO IS STILL DRAWING LARGE ENTRIES FOR ITS AMATEUR CIRCUIT.

This time, the Circuit made its stop at the COLTON Ranch, Rancho Mediterrania, site of the 6th event of the season.


The entry was not as large as the entry for the "double points" contest at SKATE CITY, but it still managed to pull in 173 amateur skaters from as far north as Santa Barbara and Bakersfield and as far south as El Centro and San Diego.

The two events for the day were the Banked Slalom and Pool. The latter

was held at the famous Gold Cup lool, built earlier this year especially by for the Gold Cup. It's a hot pool and easy to get used to.

For the first time this season there was no practice prior to the start of the competition on Saturday.

This was received with mixed emotions, as some skaters felt that the two practice runs given to each skater prior to the start of his class, was not enough; while others thought that it was just fine be-

Lakewood bears watching as they could be the dark horses to make a strong move for the top spot, since they will have the last "double points" contest at their park.

Fifth through ninth were: MARINA, PIPELINE, DEL MAR, SKATE CITY and OASIS.

These next three events are going to be really wild, since the team race is so tight and although certain parks may have the advantage of the "home park", from what we've seen so far this season, that advantage may not be so clear as skaters in the circuit know most of the parks in ASPO, and they can skate just as good in another park as they can skate at their home park.

It's a credit to ASPO that it has developed this type of skill and attitude among all skaters and it has drifted away from the attitude that if you weren't skating in your own park, you didn't have a chance.

PARK TEAM DIVISION:

12 & UNDER- There were no major surprises in this division as Doug Cobalis (COLTON), won once again both events.

It doesn't matter if it's his home park or not, Doug now has four perfect meets this season, winning both events.

He's picked up first place overall trophies at MARINA, DEL MAR, OASIS and COLTON and just barely missed out at SKATER-CROSS and SKATE CITY.

13-14 PARK TEAM- Lester Kasai was injected into the BIG O team for this event and won the Pool event, while Eddie Bettencourt (PIPELINE) took the Banked Slalom event.

Eddie Bettencourt still holds the lead in class with 1200 points, but only by 11 points, just ahead of Richard Armijo from Skate City.

15-17PARK TEAM- Todd Joseph still remains the dominant force in this group, picking up a first in the Pool event, while John Downs, skating for SKATERCROSS won the Slalom event.

Still, Todd leads the class by 150 points.

OPEN PARK- SkaterCross was well represented by Jim Coane in the pool event as he took the first spot, beating out local favorite Glenn Shuchuck from COLTON.

The slalom event belonged to Kent Douglas, now skating for the LAKEWOOD Team.

The OPEN class is still led by Scott Fraley(PIPELINE), but only by 4 points!

Andre Watts(MARINA) is just that close behind, ready to move in and so is Jim Coane, the early leader in this class.

1 A UNSPONSORED CLASS

12 & UNDER- Jeff Grosso took the pool event while up-and-coming hot skater, Jeff Heath won the

Jeff is putting on a strong bid to overtake current leaders Youree Henley(1st) and Charly Pina(2nd). Jeff is currently in third, but has the look of a hungry skater.

13-14 UNSP. This is the biggest class of all ASPO CLASSES AND the most hard fought. Ron Yearman still holds the lead, just ahead of Richard Ito.

Ron's win in the Pool event at COLTON, will help keep the distance between he and second place, with 14 points difference.

The Slalom event was won by Cida Das Lee, a classy name for a classy skater

15-17 UNSP.- A new face took the winner's spot in the pool event. It was Dave Bedorf, who had just signed up today, to compete in his first ASPO. His specialty must be pool, since he did not compete in

That event was won by Keith Stephenson, who only recently started skating ASPO at Marina.

OPEN UNSP.- Ron Mahoffy took the Pool event while current leader, Mark Bailey won the Slalom.

Mark's 1195 points has Adrian Lozano and Charlie Lewis working hard to catch up.

2 A UNSPONSORED DIVISION

12 & UNDER- This class had to wait until late in the evening to make their pool and slalom runs.

Although it may have been a long wait, their enthusiasm was not affected nor their intensity.

Eric Berquist keeps getting stronger as the season progresses as he took a first in both events.

13-14 UNSP.- Lester Kasai was victorious in the Pool, and Paul Young won the Slalom. Both skaters have made this class a much tighter race by putting pressure on current leader Mike Krueger, who managed a second and a third.

15-17 UNSP.- Henry Matus was two points behind leader Rick Tracey, coming into this event. Henry's two first places has now moved him up to first in this class by 23 points ahead of Tracey. John

Downs currently holds the third spot but could be the guy to watch in the next three contests.

OPEN UNSP.- This class saw Kenny Williams win the Pool and James Murphy take the Banked Slalom.

The race for first in this class is now much tighter as current leader Kent Douglas (1294) leads James Murphy (1263) by only 31 points.

ROLLER SKATERS

WOMEN- Pam Cass and Sue Feldman shared the spot light, each winning one of the two events. Pam won the Slalom and Sue won the Pool. Pam still leads this class.

MEN 1 A- Rick Klopher won the pool and has moved a bit closer to second place Bobby Chase. The leader still remains Tracy Baldwin, who had a second in the pool and third in the slalom.

Winner of the Slalom event was newcomer, Joey Ramon.

2 A MEN- Jamie Ide still leads this division, with his two impressive wins today. His lead is now 60 points over second place Paul Votava, who placed fourth in both events.

Noteworthy; was the outstanding

performance in the pool by Dale Calvert. Dale has a great and unique routine that had the crowd wild.

GIRL SKATEBOARDERS:

Sue Smith won the Slalom while Carabeth Burnside can not be beaten in the pool event.

3 A SEMI PROS:

12 & UNDER- Chris Hosoi showed that his pool win at Marina was no fluke, as he also took the COLTON pool event.

Winner of the Slalom was Kenny Stelmasky.

Tony Hawk, leader of this class managed a second in the pool and fourth in the slalom.

13-14- Bob Serafin continues his almost perfect record of wins.

Had he not scored a second place in the OASIS pool event, he would be the only skater with a perfect record of wins, because he has managed to win first place in all but one of the 14 events so far this season.

This is truly remarkable when you consider that this is one of the toughest classes and you can't always get practice at some of the parks.

His 1395 points is by far the best of any of the over 400 skaters that have participated so far this season

15-17 - Lance Mountain put on a great performance in the pool event. He came up with a couple of new tricks that he will perfect for the coming Gold Cup.

The Slalom, event was won by the hard charging Eddie Meek, current leader in this class.

OPEN-Sonny Miller maintained his points lead by taking the pool event and Rusty Morris captured the banked slalom.

Watch out for Rusty, now in fourth, to make a run for the top spot.

NOVEMBER 15th is the date for the next ASPO to be held at the PIPELINE Skatepark, in Upland. The events will be: Pool(s) and Banked Slalom once again.

But the story is not just that. It's the story of all the Pros and Amateurs that competed this season, and the "shot in the arm" they gave to the sport of skateboarding.

The footnote to the story is the fact that at the PIPELINE, Neil Blender (G & S) emerged as the Amateur winner and Steve Caballero (POWELL/PERALTA) was the Prowinner.

Just as important, the "sport" was the winner.

Also, the story has to include the efforts of Don Hoffman and the



Second spot went to a surprising Steve Alba, who had strong runs which netted him 109.57.



In the Semi-Pro division, highest qualifier was Neil Blender(G & S), who scored an 87.66.

Neil has been threatening all season long to put on a strong showing. Today, he made good.

Second amateur qualifier was John (Tex) Gibson. John flew in just in time to work out in the pools and find the right lines.

Third through fifth qualifiers were: Lance Mountain, who looked very strong; Chris Hosoi, who appeared to be dwarfed by the size of the pools, yet managed to be as "bio" as any skater there; and Billy Ruff, who earned an 84.66 with a solid run.

SUNDAY FINALS

AMATEURS:

Rather than eliminate one skater from the field of 15 amateur skaters because of a three way tie for the last qualifying spot, 16 amateur skaters were entered on Sunday.

The amateur semi started promptly at noon and by 1pm, the final five-man cut was made.

Qualifying in the top spot was again Neil Blender, with a score of 88.33. Neil appeared to be at ease with the large pools and just blazed them.

Christian Hosoi went into the finals in the second spot with an 88.00. He was just a fraction of a point behind Neil. The scores the judges gave these two skaters could have gone either way. They were both outstanding.

Third qualifier was John Gibson (CASTER) who put a strong but cautious run.

Fourth qualifier was Lance Mountain and fifth was Jim Grey.

AMATEUR FINALS:

In the finals, all skaters got three runs. The best two scores would be combined for their offical score.

Winning the final was Neil Blender (G & S), who scored a personal high of 89.33, on his second run and an 88.00 on his third run to make him the top point amateur skater of the day.

In second, it was John Gibson, who saved his strongest runs for the finals. He made two clean runs out of the three. He fell on his second run. His best runs featured some of the cleanest front-side ollies and smooth lines on both pools.

Third place went to Chris Hosoi, who was making some of the highest backside airs in the round pool, of any skater there.

Hosoi fell on his first and third runs, the latter, trying an acid drop. Still his routine was exciting and bio. The crowd loved it.

Fourth place went to Lance Mountain who showed a couple of new tricks, including his "gay twist" a reverse of a fakie 180, as near as we could tell.

Jim Grey, made up the top five places. He was delighted with his skating, although falls on all three runs in the finals relegated him to the 5th spot.

Billy Ruff (G & S), who managed a 6th place, still won the "overall" for the series.


Billy had a little trouble with the large pools, but still managed to place high enough to earn points to make him the "overall" winner by a margin of 11 points over John Gibson(CASTER).

Gibson's performance today moved him up from third in the standings, to the second overall spot.

PRO QUATER-FINALS

There were 15 pro skaters who started the quarter final round.
Only 10 would move on to the Semi.

The Heats were made up of five skaters each, as follows:

HEAT 1: Fred DeSoto(VARIFLEX), Micke Alba(G & S/INDY), Bert LaMar(SIMS), Mike Folmer(SIMS), and Steve Caballero(POWELL/ PERALTA).

HEAT 2: Geno Tocci(G & S), Mike Smith(DOG TOWN), Ray Rodriguez (POWELL/PERALTA), Eddie Elguera(VARIFLEX) and Steve Alba (NHS/INDY). HEAT 3: Brad Bowman(SIMS), Dave Andrecht(SIMS), Alan Losi (VARIFLEX), Mike McGill(POWELL /PERALTA) and Duane Peters (NHS/INDY).

In the first heat, it was Steve Caballero who posted the highest score, with an 89.66. He fell on his second run, but his first run held up to move him into the Semi or 10-men cut.

Second highest score of the quarter finals went to Eddie Elguera, with an 89.00.

At this point, perhaps the most dramatic moment of the series occurred, yet very few people noticed it.

The drama was that Eddie had a must situation on his second run. He had fallen in his first run twice, on relatively easy tricks. He had been scored only an 81.00

Most of the other 14 skaters had scored higher than Eddie on their first runs, so there was a good possibility that if Elguera didn't make his second run a clean run, and score high enough points, he would not make the SEM!

This would have meant that Duane

Peters or even Bert LaMar, would have had the door open to move into the top spot in the Series.

Again, no one noticed the situation except Elguera, Gil Losi(who was pale with nerves) and this reporter.

Well, as a true champion, Eddie's second run was magnificent. It included a near catastrophic, one-foot tail drop, that he made much to his surprise and delight of the crowd.

Later when we asked Gil Losi about the situation, he said: "I don't think any skater in this series has had more pressure put on him in one run, than the run that Eddie just made".

Eddie scored an 89.00. Going into the Semi in third place was Steve Alba.

Steve put on a fast-paced routine that covered both pools. Lot's of roll outs and -ins, backside crossover airs, front side airs. The judges awarded him with an 88.33

Also in third place, tied with Steve was Mike McGill. He surprised alot of people, including one of the judges, Curtiss Hesselgrave, who later confided: "you would think that a guy like McGill would have trouble with these pools because of his size, yet he blazed them!"

In the fifth qualifying spot, it was Duane Peters.

Duane had a poor first run, as he fell twice. But typical Duane, he came back on his scond run to post an 87.33.

Sixth qualifier was Micke Alba, who looked like he had a better run than the judges awarded him on his first try. Still, he managed to earn an 87.00 on his first try, he fell on the second.

There was a seventh place tie between Alan Losi and Dave Andrecht.

Because it didn't affect their making the Semi, there was no runoff.

They had identical scores of 86.66.

PRO SEMI:

Two groups of five skaters made the Semi.

In the first group, there was Mike Smith, Dave Andrecht, Micke Alba, Steve Alba and Eddie Elguera.

The second group had: Bert LaMar, Alan Losi, Duane Peters, Mike McGill and Steve Caballero.

The highest score in the first heat was posted by Steve Caballero, he had a 91.00. His second run was outstanding, after a shaky first run.

By this time he had made a couple of changes in his lines and added a couple of tricks.

In the second heat, Steve Caballero posted an identical high score of 91.00. His run included again a 360 ollie, higher than before that the crowd loved.

Qualifying in third and making it to the final was Mike McGill. He seemed in complete control in both pools. His runs included some bio backside airs and front side ollies. He scored a 90.00 on both of his runs.

Fourth qualifier into the final was Duane Peters. He scored an 89.66 on his second run.

Last skater to make the final was Steve Alba, who also scored an 89.66. Steve's a local at PIPELINE with lots of friends in the stands, which cheered for him and made him skate inspired.



THE FINAL

In order for Elguera to catch or pass him, he would have to score a 94.00. If any one could do it, it would be Eddie.


But today was not his day, despite an excellent qualifying round. Eddie fell on his third run and scored only an 89.00.

LONG

LINES

IT COSTS ALOT MORE COIN TO put a board together nowadays, so to offset this we're finding alot of protective accessories available to the skate-clone, to help protect that investment

ACCESSORIES AND THEIR FUNCTION:

NOSEGUARD: Protects the nose of the deck from cracking and delaminating due to heavy impact.

TAILBLOCKS: Protects the tail area from being destroyed by kickturns, tailstalls and tailslides.

SLIDEBARS: Keeps the bottom of the board protected from grinding, and splintering during board slides. It keeps the deck from cracking in half during "pogos" and they function also as aerial grab-bars.

RE-ENTRY BARS: Basic function is to provide less hungups from rear truck during straight in re-entries, board slides and rock n' rolls. They also protect the kingpin from snapping due to impact on coping or street curbs.

COPERS: Plastic or urethane device attached to the truck or axel.

This protects the axel from wear due to heavy grinding and also allow for smoother slides across the coping. They also protect the coping on the pools from being damaged.

It's alot of fun doing slide n' rolls on smooth coping and not getting stuck on the rough stuff.

MOUNTING TIPS:

I suggest that when you put these protective devices on your board, that you use nuts and bolts where-ever possible. This move can save you some time and money in the long run.

Some deck manufacturers will not replace your board or refund money when your deck breaks and they find out it has screw holes in it. Screws have a tendency to loosen and vibrate during rides. This weakens the deck construction and also leaves you constantly adjusting your equipment or even snapping a lot of slide bars in half.

By using nuts and bolts, it's a lot easier to replace old and worn out accessories with new stock and not damage your deck.

If you want to lighten the load for a contest, just unbolt the stuff you don't need (noseguard, tailblock & front coper) to make it lighter. And when you mount the equipment back on, you don't have to worry about stripping out the mounting holes.

INVERT AND MULTIPLY:

Besides, it's no fun running over screws at the bottom of the pool anyway.

And remember, it's a long way to Alaska on steel wheels.






ASPO

EDITORIAL

HOW MANY TIMES MUST IT BE SAID?

This is directed to all manufacturers and sponsors.

Heed the warning.

Skateparks and retailers are getting tired of continually having to police their parking lots and surrounding areas to keep skaters, mostly team skaters, from selling your goods to prospective customers.

Some of you still persist in looking the other way.

There was more evidence of this happening at the Gold Cup event and at other recent events.

How many times more is it going to take for some of you to realize that you are going to bring an end to the good relation between your retailer and you.

Some of you who keep flowing equipment to skaters are undermining the very existance of the park and retail system.

You can not afford to be without a Park system.

The parks are a focal point for all skaters, your skaters, for your research and development and improvement of your equipment.

It's not a joke any more. It's incomprihensible that some of you are undermining the very life of the sport.

The Solution: All sponsors must place tighter controls on the equipment you give out to your skaters; Pros and amateur skaters alike.

Your skaters must realize that the equipment you are providing to them is to be used to promote your line, and to give you "feedback information" as to how to improve it.

Those skaters should realize that the equipment you let them use is not for THEIR PERSONAL GAIN. You should ask to get back any used equipment from your skaters before issuing new ones. Even if the equipment is totally thrashed.

The "cancer" that once a few years ago reached epidemic proportions is noticeably on the rebound.

Perhaps some of you are paying your skaters with goods instead of the hard to get cash.

Perhaps, equipment is going out your back door.

In any case it is wrong.

Perhaps you get caught up with the idea that during a competition if everyone is skating with your stuff, you'll get more business.

THIS IS WRONG! To those of you who passed out countless

items to anyone who would skate with it at the last Gold Cup, please note that you are helping to do away with your own retailers.

The bottom line is that retailers will band together and simply drop your line of equipment, in their shops.

This will be a war that no one will win and the "sport" will lose.

This problem wasn't just noticed this past weekend, but it's been coming along.

The time is now to put a stop to it, before the Holidays.

Many of your retailers are counting on the Christmas period to make up for the lack of business during the summer and fall.

If we don't correct this situation now, our future, all of ours, looks bleak.
