

Next was the Men's 20 & over division.

Rusty Morris placed 1st in class, showing that after several nasty injuries, he still has what it takes to keep the crowd on the edge of their seats.

Later in the afternoon, the Men's 14-16 class gave the large crowd (over 200 paid), and photographers, examples of some of the best skating maneuvers ever seen in any other contest.

It seems that from contest to contest, skaters get better and better.

Scot Foss from the Northern California Powell-Bones-Peralta brigade, astonished spectators with a variety of innovative tricks. This resulted on his first place win.

Stacy Peralta's protegee, Steve Caballero took 2nd. on what had to be very close judging.

Gino Tocci, from the San Diego area took 3rd. place honors, followed by Marina's ripper, Pat Ngoho in 4th.

The 16-19 division was next.

Val skater Brad Meyers skated to 1st. place. A smooth style earned him a much desired, but unexpected win. Brad was very surprised.

Pat Carmody placed 2nd. and Jim Gray ended in 3rd.

Overall the contest ran very smooth, except at the end it was difficult to obtain a result list.

Everett Rosecrans, Director of the series had his hands full but we expect in the following series he'll have it all sorted out. Our compliments go to him.

Also on the scene, doing a fine job were park owner Dennis Ogden and manager Doug Noble. Dog Bowl skaters, Jimmy Plummer and "da Jer" Valdez were seen floating around adding color to the event.

Trophies and Vans tennis shoes were awarded to the winners.

The "overall " team effort went to the Variflex Team.

Four of their skaters ended in first in their division.

Allen Losi, Rusty Morris, Patti Hoffman and Ty Lambert were all winners.

Tied for 2nd. overall went to the Sims and Vans team and Powerflex placed 4th.

The All American Series next moves to the Pipeline on September 1st; Big O on Sep. 29th and to SkaterCross, Reseda on October 20th.

Events between schools could be held at local skateparks. Similar to High School Moto-X competitions.

Well, the possibilities of this happening are greater than most people think.

This Fall, the Boy Scouts of America, Explorer Scouts division, will be attempting to organize skateboard posts in every High School in Southern California.

The goal is to make it National.

Working closely with Skateboard Parks, the Explorer Executives will be contacting schools to organize the program.

rany of the Executives have already been indoctrinated to the sport by watching the action at skateboard parks.

What they have seen is; that with proper supervision and control, excellent safety standards and a few dedicated adults to lead the way, skate-boarding is one of the most exciting sports to participate in and to watch.

The energy and dedication of the skateboarders, have made a great impression on the Executives.

They now want to harness this energy and put it to good use.

Many schools have been troubled by skateboarders.

They've tried to correct the problem by simply banning skateboards from campus.

What the Explorers wish to do is to turn the problem into a very possitive solution.

Explorer posts already exsist in High Schools.

There are Hiking and Sailing posts, Skiing and Surfing and even Flying posts.

None can compare in potential for participants, as skate-boarding can.

The Explorer Executives see this as a great source of young adults.

The skateboard industry should see this as a great opportunity to propagate the sport.

We must help achieve this goal.

If you are a skater, join the post at your local park or start one in your school.

Ask the principal to contact an Explorer Executive in your area.

(A directory for the Southern California area of Explorer Executives, appears in this issue.)

If you are a parent of a skateboarder, get involved in the program.

Also, contact the school and let them know that you will help organize a post.

All it takes to set up an Explorer Post is to have five(5) active adults and five(5) active skaters, ages 14 to 20.

Also, a reasonable amount of interest and then have fun!

Once signed as a Skateboard Explorer, the skater can take advantage of other Explorer activities at reduced rates.

In addition, skateparks that have set up Posts are already offering discounts on sessions and sales.

What more can you ask?
