Also lots of questions about the "doubles" contest on Sunday. Either one of the pools or BOTH can be used for the contest. Remember, judges like to see variety of execution so keep that in mind. For more information about the contest, call SkaterCross at (213)344-7040 and be therefor the last fling of Christmas Vacation!

Recently, we received a proposal from the Cascade Racing Association and Doug Hitch for future Downhill and Slalom competition. This is what that proposal said: "To the NSRO, URA, ASPO, manufacturers, prospective contestants and sponsors of a Summer 1981 West Coast Downhill/Slalom- Five City-Five Contest PRO/AM Tour. I think that everyone realizes the success of Capitola and Laguna Seca, also the banked Slalom at Colton and Marina. What I am hoping to help make happen is a similar set of races next August within a two week period, so that the leading PRO/AM contestants would schedule personal vaca-tions or time off to compete in the full series. We would produce five contets in approximately fifteen days. The series would start in Seattle, Washington and head south, stopping in Portland, Santa Cruz, Los Angeles and winding up at La Costa". This proposal also calls for each event being a separate entity with trophies and cash awarded for each, but also carrying the points from each of the five events toward the "overall" win at the end of the series. Let us hear from some of you racers/promoters/sponsors about this idea. It sounds good to us.

More on the proposal. How would you travel, where would you stay you ask? Well, this is where the joint efforts of skaters-promoterssponsors come in. When up in the Northern States, skaters from the South would stay at other skaters houses. When down in the South. the same arrangement can be made for the Northern skaters. Traveling pools can be arranged so that the cost of getting there can be split by many. Like a caravan of skaters. Besides, that's a nice way to spend part of the summer. Call us to express your opinion or you can also let Doug Hitch know, I'm sure he'd like to hear from you. His number is (206) 866-6228.

We promise you, this was our last mistake for the year. In our last issue we said that KONA Skatepark in Jacksonville was having the Pepsi Challenge competition, while in fact it was being held, as it always is, at the Sensation Basin Skatepark in Gainsville, Florida. Paul Schmitt, of SCHMITT STIX fame, called us to let us know that he's now coming out with Truck Guards. These should be out in the market within a couple of weeks. Also he's got a new color for his side rails...purple!

Lots of controversy at the recent Lakewood PRO/AM. There's two sides to every story as they say. Granted, the contest should have not been labeled and publicized as a \$1,500. event, while it depended on entry and banner space moneys to make the "pro purse" but also, a skatepark owner can only put on a PRO/AM event if he feels that he's going to get support from most of the industry. In this case, there was only one banner space sold, add to that a poor entry, and you have a very ticklish situation. C'mon guys, we've got to work these things out together or there just won't be any more Pro/Am events in the future.

One real disappointing scene at Lakewood Pro/Am, was the fact that skaters and event Sponsors were passing out gate tickets to their friends so they wouldn't have to pay to get in. It's bad enough when a skater does it because he's taking money away from his own pocket, but when some of the team sponsors do it, that's got to be low. If you can't afford to pay \$3.00 to see the best in your sport, then you don't belong in it. I'm off my soap box now.

Want to know how to improve your skatepark business during the week? Set up SKATN NEWS PHOTO SESSIONS once a week. Let your skaters know that you're going to shoot one or two rolls of black and white and you're going to send them (the pics) in to us. We promise we'll try to print as many as we can each issue. It's good for us and it's good for you. Makes sense?

Speaking of our SKAT'N NEWS, our Publisher has decided by popular demand from our readers and advertisers to Publish on a quarterly basis a SKATN NEWS Supplement!

Gil Losi is working out the arrangements and it should be announced after the first of the year. We understand that KONA's Half Pipe wooden ramp is one of the best in the country and should make it a great

Z Products, the Santa Monica -based company has a new truck protector unit coming out. It's called the TRANS BEAM II. It will bolt on under the trucks, like a riser pad and wraps around over the truck bolt. It's made out of the same fine "super white" material that they use for their sliders, copers and trans beams. Ask your dealer for The next ASPO at BIG O will have a change of event. Instead of the Pipe-Pasting event that was scheduled, there will be a TIGHT SLALOM event. Current construction of Big O's water slide has necessitated this change.

VARIFLEX's "X", black hub wheels should be out by the first of the year. They are 94 D. Also VARIFLEX is now coming out with their new ALAN LOSI model. It's a medium size model, for medium size skaters.(10 1/8 X 29 5/8) It'll be a "notch-back" style, similar to a stinger, made out of rock maple. 6ply wood, with "sex bolts" to hold all the stuff together and lots of bright graphics.

The VANS Demo Team has been kept busy lately with stops at many Southern California spots. For example: Nov.21, they wowed the crowd at St. John Bosco's High in Bellflower, especially when Mike Johnson did his freestyle demo. Then on Nov.22, they appeared at the Orange County Fairgrounds for Explorer Post 1471. The next day, Nov.23rd, they drove to Calexico, California, near the Mexican border and put on a great show there for lots of skaters from Calexico, Mexico and even San Diego. Brian Martin, Mike Johnson, Beatle and Kele Rosecrans, Christian Hosoi, Mike Smith and Steve Rocco are all part of the VANS crew of rippers.

We hear that COLTON is putting in a MINI-BAJA-type of "off road" track for these Radio controlled cars. SkaterCross has been having good success with theirs so, Colton is going to give it a shot.

Last year only two major companies(both from Santa Barbara) snaked and exploded their wares to the public.





# CABALLERO SHREDDS THE PIPE!

# STEVIE CABALLERO

Lakewood, California Dec. 7,1980

STEVE CABALLERO PICKED UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF IN THE "GOLD CUP SERIES" BY WINNING THE LAKEWOOD HALF PIPE PRO EVENT AND JOHN GIBSON SERVED NOTICE THAT WHETHER HE DECIDES TO RAMAIN AMATEUR FOR NEXT SEASON OR TURN PRO, HE WILL BE ONE HELL OF A SKATER TO BEAT, AS HE TOOK THE AMATEUR DIVISION.

This half pipe event was labeled as a \$1,500. Pro purse contest, but it fell short of that amount by about 50%, as the Pro entry (14) and Amateur entry (24) was much less than originally anticipated.

As a result, promoter and park owner Joel Vest, had a decision to make early Sunday morning. He called a meeting among the Pros entered in the contest and let the facts be known. Insufficient banner space bought by manufacturers and a small entry made it impossible for him to come up with the \$1,500. advertised purse. He would either have to cancel the

event or lower the "purse".
All pros decided to lower the purse and have the contest.



As a result the Pro-purse was broken as follows with the winners getting: 1. Steve Caballero (\$300.); Mike Smith (\$150.); Duane Peters (\$75.); Micke Alba (\$55.); Kevin Moore and Alan Losi each received \$35.00 and Steve Alba and Steve Hirsch each getting \$25.00.

As a result of the pre-contest meeting and delay, the contest started later than scheduled, with many pros having to sit around for several hours before getting to practice, waiting for the amateurs to finish.

Curtiss Hesselgrave, contest director, used a different system of competition from the Gold Cup events. Namely, after the eight skater cut, the competition switched from "heats" to "head to head" competition.

The general reaction to this system

was mixed. Most skaters seemed to like it, while others, especially some of the spectators felt it made for a long event.

# THE COMPETITION:

# THE AMATEURS:

Out of the 24 amateurs entered, only eight would make it into the final "head to head" program. The eight skaters who made it were Bob Serafin(NHS/INDY): John Gibson (CASTER); Lance Mountain (VARIFLEX); BILL RUFF (G&S); Chris Hosoi (DOG TOWN); Mike Hirsch (VARIFLEX); Neil Blender (G&S); and Pat Ngoho (Functional Design).

Honorable mention goes to two girls brave enough to compete with the boys. Sue Smith and Carabeth Burnside gave it a good attempt. Carabeth, in fact, wound up only 2 points away from making the cut! She outscored 10 other skaters!

The way this first round of "double elimination" was scheduled was: The skater with the highest points in the qualifying round went against the skater with the lowest of the final eight. Second went against 7th place; Third against 6th and so on.

Each skater got two runs. The best of the two would count.

So, the first two skaters were John Gibson who defeated Pat Ngoho. Then it was Bob Serafin defeating Neil Blender; Lance Mountain winning over team mate Mike Hirsch; and finally Billy Ruff over Christian Hosoi

The four winners moved to the winners bracket, while the four losers moved to the "losers" bracket.

One more loss for anyone in the "losers" bracket would knock them out of any further competition. You were only allowed two defeats.

The next round in the winners bracket saw John Gibson post an 85.33 to beat Bob Serafin's 84.00. Also Lance Mountain scored a high 85.00 to Ruff's 84.66, to narrowly beat him and send him to the other bracket.

Now it was the skaters in the loser's bracket to do battle. One loss and you were out.

Managing to stay alive in this bracket was Pat Ngoho who defeated Neil Blender who fell in both of his runs; and Chris Hosoi who beat Mike Hirsch.

This left six skaters. Two had perfect records (no losses) and four that had one loss each.

Pat Ngoho was paired with Billy Ruff. Billy fell on both of his runs and Pat's 85.00 was enough to relegate Bill to 6th place in the contest.

Next it was Bob Serafin against Chris Hosoi. Bob's 83.66 was just one point more than Hosoi. Chris wound up in 5th.

The only two undefeated skaters were next; Gibson and Mountain. Gibson emerged the winner, showing great consistancy in his runs.

This sent Lance Mountain to go against the winner of the Ngoho/ Serafin duel. Serafin proved to work well under pressure and beat Pat, sending him to 4th place.

There being only three skaters left, one with a perfect score(GIBSON) and two with only one loss, the next round was to eliminate one of the in two skaters in the loser's bracket.

Lance Mountain went against Bob Serafin. Serafin scored and 84.66 to Mountain's 84.33, in the first run. On Mountain's second run he caught his board on the fence and scored a lower score of 83.66. So the stage was set, it was Bob Serafin who had lost one, against John Gibson who had a perfect score.

If John won this round it would be all over as Serafin would have lost twice. If Bob won, they would have to go one more time.

No such chance. John Gibson (CASTER) was in perfect form today and he showed that his pipe skating back home in Texas, was solid enough to beat the best in the West Coast.

# THE PROS:

The Pro heats were conducted in the same way as the amateurs. The top eight advancing to the head to head competition.

It was surprising to see some of the pros who are usually among the top ten in the Gold Cup, not making the cut of eight. A few of these were: Dave Andrecht, Ray Rodrigues, Eddie Elguera (winner of the Gold Cup Series); and Eric Grisham who once again just missed the cut behind Steve Alba.

The final eight were in this order. Duane Peters, Micke Alba, Kevin

captured him the win at Lakewood in the Semi-Pro class. He's currently sponsored by CASTER. Ph. Votava.

Moore, Alan Losi, Mike Smith, Steve Hirsch, Steve Caballero and Steve Alba.

One again the first two contenders were the first qualifier against the 8th qualifier.

So, Duane Peters went against Steve Alba and defeated him with a score of 86.66.

Micke Alba and Steve Caballero went next and Caballero put on an excellent routine that scored him an 86.00 to Micke's 85.00.

Kevin Moore made a rare appearance in pro competition and surprised everyone by beating Steve Hirsch.

Alan Losi and Mike Hirsch were next and Mike Smith showed that he had the half pipe lines well in sight. He beat Losi.

Advancing to the "winner's" bracket were: Peters, Caballero, Moore and Smith.

In the "loser's" bracket were: both Alba brothers and Losi and Hirsch.


Interestingly both brothers had to go against each other and also team mates (VARIFLEX) Losi and Hirsch had to do like wise. Only two would earn the right to continue up the ladder.

Micke beat brother Steve Alba and Losi won over Steve Hirsch.

The next round had Kevin Moore going against Micke Alba and Alan Losi against Steve Caballero. Both Alba and Caballero emerge winners.

Now there just four skaters left.

Coming from the "loser's" bracket were Micke Alba and Steve Caballero. Steve defeated Micke with some neat backwards inverts and totally bio frontside ollie airs.

In the winner's bracket it was Duane Peters against Mike Smith. Mike won the match up narrowly beating Duane with a score of 84.66 to Duane's 84.33

Both Caballero and Peters had now lost one match. Smith remained unbeaten.

The next round was between Caballero and Peters. Duane had a poor run and not so good second. He fell twice, once at the beginning of his routine and once with about 15 seconds left. Peters took 3rd.

Once again the stage was set between one skater with a perfect record(Smith) and one skater with one loss(Caballero). If Steve lost this match, it would be all over, if Smith lost, they would have to go again to break the tie.

Could Steve come from behind and do it? Could he outperform Smith who had been steady all day?

The answer is yes. He had to win this round to stay "alive" in the competition. He pulled some of the highest fronside airs to post the highest scores of the day according to the judges. He posted an 87.00 to Smith's 85.66.

This sent the finals in a tie and one more round of head to head.

Mike Smith came back with a strong first run in this last round. He posted an 86.33, but wait so did Steve Caballerol. He had a similar score!

The judges were making the matter rough for themselves and sending the crowd in a frenzy.

Two more runs were left. Steve took his run first and had a beautiful routine going until he fell just seconds before his time was up. The judges awarded him an 85.33 for his second run.

Well it looked like the contest was in Mike Smith's hand. He had been consistant all day long. All he had to do is make his regular run, without falling and he had the win.

Mike started his routine looking

real clean as the seconds ticked down on the clock, but as in all competition, you not only have to be good, but you also have to come through under pressure.

Smith fell on a layback with only five

seconds left on the clock. Would the judges award him enough points to beat out Steve who had also fallen on his last run?

The entire crowd fell silent, with eyes glued to the score board, for what seemed an endless amount of

Then, there it was, Mike was given an 84.66, one full point less than Caballero's and was relegated to second place.

Coming from behind taking the top honors was POWELL/PERALTA's mighty pro, Steve Caballero, who seems to be getting better and better under pressure with each contest. Watch out for next year.

This was the last scheduled Pro event of 1980. Unfortunately, because of the poor turnout of skaters there seems to be a doubt. weather there may be many more in

Very few promoters or park owners will attempt another one unless they can be assured of the full endorsement and support of both, skaters, manufacturers and spon-

We hope that next year, either through a series like the Gold Cup, or individual promotions, there can be more Pro events, where people don't have to lose money or break even in order to have one.

# JOHN GIBSON

"TEX"

JOHN "TEX" GIBSON, UNKNOWN TO MANY IN THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA EARLY THIS YEAR, HAS NOW MADE HIS PRESENCE KNOWN BY COMPETING IN THE EARLY ASPO'S AND THEN IN THE GOLD CUP SERIES.

A QUIET, POLITE SKATER, OFF THE TURF, HE UNLEASHES HIS ENERGY WHEN IT COMES TO COMPETITIONS. HE HAS COMPETED WITH THE BEST AMATEURS AROUND AND HE RANKS RIGHT UP THERE WITH THEM.

We caught up with him at the recent Lakewood ASPO, where he had flown in from Pasadena, Texas, especially to compete in the PRO/AM scheduled the next day.

We talked about his "back home" scene, what he likes and dislikes and about the upcoming contest and season.

John rides for CASTER and we feel they've got a gold mine in him...

How old are you? 16.

And where were you born? **Houston, Texas.** 

Where do you live now?

Pasadena, Texas. It's a little suburb of Houston.

Do you have any brothers or sisters?

Yeah, I've got two brothers and one sister; Jeff, Greg, and Shonda. My sister lives in Dallas and my brothers, they just live at home and they both play in a band.

Do they skate?

Uh, no, but they used to, they skated when they were about my age. They had a little skateboard, that's really where I picked it up, when they got burned out on it. I just cruised around on it and everyone got into it in the neighborhood.

Is there a park near you now where you skate?

Well, there was about four parks but they all closed down in the summer. Now when I go back to those parks that are closed down, there's about 20 people I've never seen before that skate. It's really sort of picking up, just a little.

What do you mainly skate?
Well, I skate this fiberglass half
pipe with a flat bottom. It's similar to a pool but it's not curved
and got coping on it.

What do you parents think about your skating?

Ith they think they're really

Uh, they think... they're really happy for me, and my brothers.. well sometimes they get after me, they say, "Oh, why don't you take me along, tell them you need a manager in California" and all that stuff.

You skate for CASTER, now that you've proven to be a force in the amateur division, do you think they might be thinking of putting out a Gibson designed board?

Well they asked me to start drawing up a design, but if it ever comes out, it will be late in the summer...yeah, probably by the end of summer.

Back home, who are some of the guys you like to skate with? There's a few of 'em over there, Joe Nichols and Jay Garcia and some other guys...Allen Mc Clean. Us four would skate about every day after the park

closed down.

Is there alot of skaters in your area?

Yeah, just alot...sort of just starting out, just ride around on the streets.

You've been in our paper a few times and in magazines. What do these guys say to you when they see you in them?

They couldn't believe it, they never think I make it at first, then they were really surprised.

You surprised alot of people out here when you came out and competed in the ASPO's and some of the other contests. How did you feel about competing with these guys out here and doing as well as you did? Oh, I had alot of fun, there was alot of competition out here, alot more than there is in Texas. It was pretty hard, I had to work for it.

Do you see alot of difference, for instance in style, between the California skater versus the Texas skater?

Uhm...really, everybody has their own style, but there's just not that many skaters in Texas to compare.

Who are some of your favorite skaters out here?

Oh, let's see... Duane Peters and Steve Caballero, and like Chris Strople. We just went with Chris and skated a back-yard pool and Chris just tore it up. Like it was pretty kinked, but I can see how he was real good in his time, back in the backyard pool, just by what he was doing.

Was that pool around here?

It was in Pasadena, where he lives.

Whose pool was it?

It was one of his friends. It's just across the school he used to go to and they just let him skate it all the time.

You're an amateur for CASTER SKATES, do you think they,or you, might decide to turn pro soon, or will you stay amateur for a while?

Well, I'm gonna see what's gonna happen during the summer time, if there's gonna be another series or not. I might go pro for that series, but if there's not going to be one, I'll probably stay amateur.

What did you think of the GOLD

CUP SERIES?

Yeah, it was a good series... good series, I liked it and had lots of fun. Well put together.

Would you like to see a series like that on a national level?
Yeah, like there's some good parks like in Alabama. I hear there's some good parks in Florida and the East Coast. I guess I might be going there soon, for Easter maybe.

Have you skated any parks back East?

No, just one park in Oklahoma, as far as other states.

How do you go about preparing for a contest, as far as working out your lines and so forth?

Well, I just sit there, at first I just figure it all out in my mind what I'm gonna do. Give it a try and work on it. And if it looks good and Chris (Strople) tells

me it looks good, I'll just practice on it.

When you're checking out your lines and the pool, if there's a kink, what do you do, work around it?

Well I don't really have to work around it, but adapt to it, and flow with it, don't be all stiff and just relax.

You were talking about Chris Strople. Does he help you alot with your skating?

Yeah, he gets me psyched out before the contest. (laughs)

Has anybody helped you with tricks?

Yeah, Chris helped alot and Wally Inouye and you know, who ever's there usually helps me, if I need help.

How do you go about learning a new trick?

I just go out and practice it on the bank first. If it's pretty easy on the bank, then I'll go out and practice it low on the half pipe and try them out and just work on it until it feels good.

Some skaters we've interviewed say that they like to think of a new trick like at night. Have you ever done that?

Yeah, I'll sit there, or at school when I'm not doing anything, and try to think of some good lines for a pool and tricks.

The people you go to school with, do they know what you're doing in skateboarding...how well you're doing?

Yeah, most of them do. They've seen the magazine and stuff, and they say, "Wow! I can't believe what you're doing... going out to California, and getting your trips paid by sponsors and stuff!"... Yeah!

It's really amazing how well you've done. Being away from California and not having too much practice, is that something you really wanted to do and work hard for, to show well here?

Well see, it's like I always wanted to come to California. I was planning to one summer, then I entered a contest in Okalhoma, that's when Chris Strople picked me up and said he'd fly

me out here and wow! I couldn't believe it!

What would you like to do in skateboarding in the future? I'd like to get a park built that I can use, cuz then if it's good enough, maybe get a GOLD CUP Series all over the country, Texas, Alabama and stuff.

Do you think that your city needs or wants a skatepark? There may be a need, it's hard to tell right now, just have to keep hoping. We're gonna write a letter to the mayor telling him that if he wants to keep us off the streets, you're gonna need a skatepark.


Do you have any favorite pools back home?

Where we live, we don't really have too many pools, 'cause the soil is real soft, it just pushes the pool out when it's out of water, so we just skate big public pools, nice and square ones, with corners and stuff. But you can only skate them two months of the year, they're a little big.

Do you have any hobbies?

Well, I'm trying to...I've just been playing on the bass guitar, 'cuz my brothers are playing some good rock n' roll stuff.

And, they're way past my ability but maybe if I get good enough, I'll be able to get in with them.

What kind of sounds they play? Just good rock n' roll...Judas Priest, AC/DC, the Cars and stuff.

What kind of music do you like? I usually like all types of music, except for the hard punk, but some of the new wave music is pretty good, I like it.

What's happening musically in Texas. Is it similar to California? Well they don't play that much punk or new wave back in Houston. They mostly have just rock n' roll. They get into...well, once in a while they'll get into DEVO, but that's as far as they go.

What do you think of the punk, new wave, DEVO stuff they play out here?

Well, you know...it's something people like to do. I can see why they like it...it's going out and having a good time in a club or something. But you know...just getting your hair cut and that kind of stuff...I don't know. You've gotta go to school and people back in Houston...you know, a bunch of red necks, they would try to pick on you... you'd get a hard time if I cut it.

Do you think you can do most of your tricks for pool in the half pipe?

Yeah, it's just going down in it and setting up.

What do you prefer. Do you think half pipes are better than pools?

Oh no!...I like skating pools much better than pipes 'cuz there's just so many things you can do in a pool. You know, no coping in half pipes, unless you put in on.

Earlier you metioned Peters and Caballero as some of your favorite Pros. How about some of the amateurs?

Neil Blender, he's good...he really tore up Upland. Let's see.. there's some other good ones like Bob Serafin, Billy Ruff and them.

When you're out here in California, where do you stay?
Usually, either at Chris
Strople's parents house or at
Wally's(Inouye). You know, I
switch off every once in a while.

Have you done any other kind of skating like freestyle, slalom? Yeah, at the Del Mar ASPO, I got first place in the banked slalom. I like banked slalom 'cuz it's fun and you get going real fast!

Are you planning to come back out here next summer?

Uh, most likely, yeah, next summer.

Before we let you go, we know you skate on a CASTER board. What about the other equipment you use?

I use Tracker magnesium trucks, with Gyro wheels. Gyro you know has the steel hubs and go real fast. Protec and Rectors, they're the most protective out right now... and those wrist braces...what are they called?... Impacts, that's it, yeah those are real good wrist guards.

Good luck tomorrow John.
Yeah, thanks alot!

(LATE WORD: John went on to win the Amateur division in the Half Pipe competition at Lakewood, not with luck but with pure skils.)

# WHAT YOUR PARKLESS CITY CAN DO FOR YOU

Next approach the local skateboard retailer in your city. Tell him about your efforts with the city. When he realizes the interest of a skate club will boost his sales, he will be glad to help and endorse your proposal.

Now, approach your parents! Get them interested in your intentions in the club. With strong parental support, just about anything is possible, elected officials will listen to voters.

Skaters in Florence, Alabama took these steps in forming a skate-board club.

Skaters in the club are now enjoying sessions at two of the State's, three parks on a regular basis.


So if you're sitting there reading this and grieving about your "Parkless City", get up and do something about it and let your City take you to the park.

The last ASPO is scheduled for the Big O Skatepark, on December 27.



Winchester Skatepark is great! The pool is certainly one of the most popular among all skaters with its ultra fine surface.


The Clover bowl and the Wave provided areas that displayed the talents of the local skaters at their best.

actions.


Winchester and its owners are to be congratulated for their fine and determined efforts to provide for a safe and fun place to skate.

ONE SPECTATOR WAS OVERHEARD TO SAY..."HEY THIS IS MORE EXCITING THAN STOCK CAR RACING". THAT MAY BE AN UNDERSTATEMENT, AS THE CAVERNS OF THE "BASIN" EXPLODED WITH APPLAUSE.

Some spectators would start to go to their cars, only to hear another roar from the crowd and they would turn around and run back up the hill to see the likes of Mike McGill firing up Sensation Basin's famous third wall.

This was the third year in a row that the Pepsi People, had sponsored skateboarding, and the contestants responded as if they had been charged to the max with "alkaline" energizers.

Contest director John Wygand organized the event so that on Friday everyone had ample time to practice.

For those from around the country who had never experienced the Sensation Basin terrain, at least sufficient time was provided to learn some of the lines.

The caliber of amateur skaters has improved greatly and it showed not only in the stylish execution of maneuvers but in the successful avoidance of injuries from having learned the proper "bailing" and "sliding the plastic" techniques.

The spectators seemed to enjoy the "sport" more, as even if someone bailed doing an "ultra bionic" trick, they could count on the skater landing safely and being




Dana Buck (Mississippi) captured 1st in the 20 & Over. Ph. Newton.

able to return to give it one more try.

Announcer Barry Zaritzky made sure that anyone who fell would raise one hand to let the officials and the crowd know that there was "no problem". This kept the tempo and energy of the event moving right along for the spectators.

Highlights of the two day event consisted of demonstrations by the pros on the walls and by Rodney Mullen in the freestyle.
